



Session Highlights

Your session met Tuesday, May 16 for our regular May meeting. Pastor Laurie led us in an opening devotion based on Luke's account of the ascension of Christ. We were reminded that we, like the disciples, are here on earth to carry on Christ's work. She then led us in an opening prayer.

We added to the calendar a piano recital featuring Laura Sutton's students, followed by an ice cream social on June 8th beginning at 6:30 PM. Communion will be served on June 4.

The PNC reported that they had a 1st meeting via ZOOM with the interested candidate. The candidate liked the fact that we are a Matthew 25 church. The PNC liked the candidate, but didn't feel they would be a good match for our church. They requested and received another match list from Presbytery. PNC emailed 6 of the newest candidates. Three responded "decline" and there was no answer from the other three. It is somewhat frustrating, but they feel that prayerful waiting is the best course of action.

The next Presbytery meeting will be at Ridgefield Crystal Lake on June 13 via ZOOM and in-person. Pastor Laurie and Diane Moore will attend.

The clerk reported the death of Carol Gooden on 5/15/2023. In God's good timing, Pastor Laurie had just recently visited Carol and Don and brought them communion.

This month's financial report shows income slightly ahead of budget and ahead of expenses year-to-date, thanks to steady giving from the congregation despite a slow decline in membership numbers over the past several years.

Pastor Laurie reported that she was out making visits and taking communion to our church family who are not able to attend worship in person and often do not have the technology to attend via ZOOM. When visiting Joyce Burright, Pastor Laurie asked if she has any words of wisdom for the church family. Joyce's hope is for the Holy Spirit to guide us and support us. Thanks, Joyce, and "Amen" to that! Pastor will meet with the Deacons at their next meeting. Pastor will be with us each Sunday until July 9, at which point she will be on vacation for two weeks. Bill Bratney is searching for pulpit supply for those two Sundays. On September 10, Pastor Laurie will not be here, due to a visit from the Kenya partnership representatives. Pastor Laurie will help facilitate the June 17 Matthew 25 Summit. Pastor Laurie made the suggestion that the church could possibly offer Stronghold camper scholarships to local children as an outreach. Session liked the idea and voted to offer three camp scholarships for Stronghold summer camps.

Sunday School will continue through the summer.

Don reported that the annual backflow valve test revealed a small leak. Walter Bros. will check into it. Matt Arjes from Boiler Whisperers inspected and cleaned out the boiler to get it ready for the next heating season. Steam condensation is causing moist conditions in the boiler room. The pipe could be moved outside so less condensation is in the space. The church currently has no working fire alarm. In 2008, an ADT fire/burglar alarm system was put into the church and was working until the contract was terminated. ADT came out and assessed the system and space. We are waiting on a report from ADT. Property and Maintenance will take steps to make sure we have a fire alarm system in place. The elevator passed the annual inspection. Don has been replacing light bulbs around the church as needed.


Sandy reminded session that Donna will be out of the office June 6-8.

Evangelism and Outreach activities have been keeping Jessica busy. The piano recital and ice cream social is always a popular event at the church, so planning is taking place for the upcoming (June 8th) event. The books we collected were taken to the Head Start preschool. The kids are really enjoying them. Head Start is revamping their COVID protocols for the 2023-2024 school year, so it is possible they will be able to re-implement the "grandparent" helpers. The teachers have asked if we would be willing to make more video recordings reading books for the kids. What are some other ways we can help with the preschool? Jessica welcomes any ideas. There is discussion regarding how we can reach out to the community for this year's Sweet Corn Festival. Perhaps we could distribute goodie bags to the kids with a few fun items and information about what our church is doing for the community, especially for the kids. Jessica welcomes ideas for fun activities we could sponsor for the kids of the community.

Andra has made some more updates to the church's web page. She and Pastor Laurie are working on adding more Matthew 25 information. \$235 was sent to the One Great Hour of Sharing fund. Of the Pentecost offering currently being received, 40% stays in the local church to help fund youth-related activities. The Rosalie McLaughlin mission funds for this year are still undesignated. The Kenya church is looking for a partner church for the Kenya church to help keep kids in schools there. The church is also seeking a prayer relationship church to offer them support in that manner as well. The baby bottle mission is currently in place through Father's Day.

Second Sunday breakfast in May was very well attended.

Our next regular Session meeting will be June 13 at 7 PM.
