Church Members and Friends,

I am humbled to serve as your covenant pastor. It has been a joy to get to know you and I look forward to getting to know you better as the weeks and months go by. You are welcome to reach out to me directly or to leave a message for me with Donna if you have a pastoral need, a question, or a suggestion.

Recently, the church joined the Matthew 25 initiative in Blackhawk Presbytery. As part of this PCUSA-wide initiative, you agree to work on one or more of three focus area: building congregational vitality, dismantling structural racism and eradicating systemic poverty. The first, congregational vitality, is what we can continue to work on during your search for a full-time pastor. This Matthew 25 initiative suggests that church vitality has seven indicators. Over the coming months I will present these marks of vitality for your own self-assessment.

The first mark is a commitment to forming disciples over every member's lifetime. This leads first to personal transformation, as people put on the heart of Christ, and then to social transformation, as people joyfully go forth into the community and tackle the issues facing today's culture.

It was my observation during this year's commissioning of new elders, that most of the congregation came forward as elders for the laying on of hands. Your church is filled with disciples... elders, deacons, and committed members. This time between permanent pastors is a time when the work of disciples is critical. Some people think they are not "qualified" to be disciples because they have not been personally transformed. Disciples are not already personally transformed, they are open to and in the process of personal transformation. Disciples are being formed over every member's lifetime. Their work is not focused inwardly, taking care of the church. Their work is focused outwardly, using the church as a foundation for reaching out to the community tackling the tough issues we face.

Congregational vitality means that our existence is vital to the community we serve. Are we making ourselves part of the life and well-being of our broader church community?

Matthew 25:44-45. 44 'Then they will reply, Lord, when did we ever see you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or naked or sick or in prison, and not help you?'



Session Highlights

Your session met Tuesday, April 11 for our regular April meeting. Pastor Laurie led us in an opening devotion based on the 20th chapter of the gospel of John; the exchange between the Risen Christ and Doubting Thomas. Pastor Laurie reminded us that we shouldn't get impatient and there is no shame in questioning. We can take our questions to God. And, by believing, we have life in His name. She then led us in an opening prayer.

We established the dates and time for the next two Session meetings: May 16 at 7 PM and June 13 at 7 PM. Communion will be served on May 7.

The PNC reported that the change to effective salary for our MIF was approved by COM and Presbytery. Based on our updated MIF, we received 12 new matches. The PNC reached out to all twelve potential candidates and received 3 "decline" responses, 1 "interested" response, and the other 6 did not respond. PNC will be scheduling a 1st meeting via ZOOM with the interested candidate.

Diane Moore and Pastor Laurie attended the April 11 Presbytery meeting. It was Diane's first time to attend. She found it very enlightening and interesting and confusing. She reports that it was nice to meet all the clergy and elders in attendance. She voted on the amendments of which she had sufficient knowledge to form an opinion. It was a hybrid meeting with 46 in-person and 26 ZOOM attendees. There was a great worship service. Pastor Laurie commented on how nice it was to hear so many good voices raised in praise during the

singing of hymns. A group that does mission through quilt-making had many quilts adorning the pews and spoke about their ministry. Pastor Laurie was commissioned to go to Kenya. There was a farewell for Rev. David Spaulding as he enters retirement. Discussion was brought by the visioning committee regarding the need to train lay leaders.

The office received a note from Bill Coughlin requesting that he be removed from the membership of Mendota First Presbyterian, as he has moved to Peru. With deep regret, Session voted to honor Bill's request and remove him from our membership.

The clerk expressed that Session is very thankful to Donna for working on making ZOOM meetings available to us again. We appreciate all she does for our church.

This month's financial report shows income ahead of expenses year-to-date, thanks to faithful giving from the congregation. Treasurer Peggy Etheridge purchased, with Session's authorization, two CDs with funds which have been held in our reserves account to gain higher rates of interest on our holdings.

Pastor Laurie reported that she has started making visits to our church family who are not able to attend worship in person and often do not have the technology to attend via ZOOM. Once she returns from her Kenya trip, she will meet with the Deacons, so she can complement their visiting schedule. She knows that many from the church family feel disconnected from the rest of the church family and life of the church and she wishes to change that. Pastor Laurie will be away April 17 to 29. In her absence, those who need pastoral care can reach out to any member of Session or John Heinekamp. Pastor Laurie has been thinking about more ideas to strengthen our position as a Matthew 25 church. How do we draw in young couples and families? How do we engage with and serve them with what we currently have to offer? Our church has a beautiful facility that could be used more, we have a good internet signal, we have an excellent camping facility in Stronghold. What are their needs? Could we open up an area for supervised homework time for use by kids whose families don't have internet access? Could we provide camper scholarships and then have the campers come back to the church and share their experiences with us? There is a home-school group looking for a space to meet. Can we fill that need?

It was decided by the teachers that Sunday School will start after the children's sermon. Sandy reports that it worked well for the students to come up to the sanctuary for communion.

Don reported on a few small issues concerning the building. We did not sustain much damage from the recent storms, though a minimal amount of water did backup into the basement, due to the main pipe has some blockage from tree roots. Also, a neighbor reported seeing a small piece of slate roofing tile come off in the storm. The walls have been repaired and trim and caulking completed from when the birds needed to be removed from inside the walls. One live bird has been seen in the church recently.

Sandy reminded session that Donna will be on vacation April 17-25. The office will not be staffed in her absence, but Sandy will check the answering machine for messages each day.

The Evangelism and Outreach Easter ham distribution went really well. All the hams have been distributed. It is always encouraging to see God's hand at work in the numbers available and the numbers needed when we do these food distributions. We are currently doing a book drive for the Head Start preschool children. Books appropriate for children ages 3 to 5 need to be to the church before the end of April. The staff really appreciates all we do to help them in caring for area children. Jessica provided them with 17 boxes of cereal from the Micropantry to help feed those students who come to school without breakfast. She will provide the families with a note sharing the location of the two local micro pantries so they can fill in needs on weekends and once summer arrives.


