Recently, Andra and I attended a Presbytery workshop called *People, Place, Purpose: How to use what you have to make a difference in your community.* We were challenged and we challenge you to help us identify all of our church's strengths and resources, and then, to identify our community needs. What is causing people pain and stress and what can we do about it?

Again, I draw your attention to the topic of church vitality. The Matthew 25 initiative in Blackhawk Presbytery challenges us to come alive to new possibilities and to actively engage in the world around us. Of the seven indicators of church vitality the third is...

An outward focus. Our church is not a place to escape from the world, but rather our gateway to our community where we may be the hands, feet, heart and mouth of Jesus Christ for people who are suffering or marginalized.

We are not meant to focus our attention on the inside of the church. How much different for us to think of our church doors as a gateway to our local mission field. It is wonderful to enter our beautiful sanctuary, but our purpose it to prepare for our exit. Our community is filled with people starved for compassion, peace and hope. They are questioning God's faithfulness while we are slow to see them or hear them or to share the good news of the gospel.



Missions Update



We are excited to form a partnership with the Maua Town Church in the Imenti North Presbytery which is part of the Presbyterian Church of East Africa (PCEA). It is our hope that we will gain a broader perspective of God's work in the world. Through this partnership, we will share correspondence and prayers in support of their ministry. Rev. Asman Wambugu Mwangi is the Parish Minister. He started a special ministry for boys living on the street. The boys receive counseling and are encouraged to further their education. Rosalie McLaughlin, a teacher, left a bequest to our church. Of that bequest, \$10,000 was set aside to be used for mission work. \$1,000 per year for ten years is to be used as the mission committee sees appropriate. Along with forming a partnership, we will also send \$1,000 to support those boys who have shown an interest in joining technical institutions. As our church is a part of Blackhawk Presbytery, it is exciting to become actively involved in this ministry. The following is from the Blackhawk Presbytery website:

"First formed in 1996, this partnership between the Presbyterian Church of East Africa and Blackhawk Presbytery is recognized by the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church (USA). The agreement provides support, training, and relationship for parishes, congregations, institutions, and pastors in the Imenti Presbyteries. Blackhawk Presbytery has provided annual training programs, exchange trips between the presbyteries, consultation, and capital funds for a Conference Training Center in Meru. A number of congregations in the presbytery are partners with congregations or institutions in Imenti presbyteries."

Please check out the website for more information on the Kenyan partnership. We thank Pastor Laurie for being our liaison in this ministry. A recent newsletter from the Presbyterian Church of East Africa is on the table in the fellowship hall.

Session Highlights

Your Session met June 13, 2023 for their regular June meeting. Pastor Laurie opened our meeting with a devotion based on Romans 5, which reminds us that perseverance builds character and hope for the future through God's love. Communion will be served July 2.

The PNC interviewed a candidate, who they liked very much. The fact that we are a Matthew 25 church and have a very utilized Micropantry were definite pluses for him, but he doesn't feel like Mendota is where he wants to be. Diane Moore and Pastor Laurie attended the June 13 Presbytery meeting. They report that there was a very interesting talk on developing communities of faith. There is a new Presbytery task force developing the idea of "1001 Communities of

Faith". Presbytery has instituted a 3% increase to the minimum salary for pastors. COM has developed a sick days policy for local churches to use. The next meeting will be in September.

The clerk reported the death of member Bill Arjes on June 5.

Following a recent bridal shower held in the church, discussion occurred regarding the need to have the area cleaned after such use. Session voted to increase the suggested donation for facility use to \$100.00 from the current \$50.00. The increase will be used to hire a cleaner for the area after events are held.

Pastor Laurie reports that she and Kay Christen took communion to shut-ins. Pastor will stay in communication with the Deacons about visits. The piano recital and ice cream social was very nice. Pastor Laurie will attend the Presbytery event "People, Place, Purpose" with Andra Goy on the 17th. Pastor will be gone July 9 and 16 on a family vacation. She will attend her home church's anniversary celebration on August 13. And on September 10th she will be away. Bill Bratney is arranging pulpit supply for these Sundays.

Sunday School is continuing through the summer. Keagon and Jacob have received camp scholarships from the church and will go to Stronghold camp July 5-8. They have been offered the opportunity to tour the "castle" ahead of time, to familiarize themselves with the camp setting.

Property and Maintenance is working on getting the fire alarm service in place and active.

Evangelism and Outreach received thank you notes from the Head Start kids for the books we donated. Head Start would appreciate our help again next school year with projects and interactions with the kids. Kenny Van Rheenen will go with Jessica to Joliet to pick up the donated food on Friday the 16th. Our garage sale is coming up. Volunteers are needed to help with set-up, the sale, and packing up. Plans are in the works to make kid's bags for distribution at the Sweet Corn Festival.

Andra reports that the Pentecost mission received \$245 through the end of May. Baby bottles will be returned on Father's Day Sunday for Abigail's Women's Center. The Rosalie McLaughlin mission gift will be given to the Kenya church for the boys going to tech college. Our church will also form a prayer and support partnership with Pastor Asman Wambugu M'wangi and the Maua Parish.

Our next meeting will be August 8, as it is our practice to not meet in July, unless a need arises.
