Session Highlights March 12, 2024

The Session of Mendota First Presbyterian Church met for their regular March 2024 meeting on Tuesday, March 12 at 7 PM at the church and via ZOOM. Present were Elders Jessica Cox, Andra Goy, Diane Moore, Sandy Rebholz, Gary Stevens, and Kim Van Rheenen (also Clerk of Session); and Moderator Pastor Laurie Walker. Excused were Elder Bill Bratney and Treasurer Peggy Etheridge. A quorum of Elders was

present. Also present were guests, Julius and Helen Hagan.

Pastor Laurie opened our meeting with a devotion based on John 14:6. We are looking to find a way – Jesus is The Way. She then led us in an opening prayer.

Adoption of the Agenda and Reading and Approval of the Minutes: The agenda was adopted by unanimous consensus. The Clerk noted 3 corrections to the minutes 1) In the Pastor's report, she will be back in the pulpit March 24, 2) In the Mission Report, correct the spelling of "Ondrea" Ward, 3) The Blanket Sunday offering brought in \$185. Gary made a correction to the Property and Maintenance Report—Mortenson Roofing will replace 6-10 tiles at the bid cost. Any other tiles will be at an additional cost. With these corrections, Diane made the motion to approve the minutes, Gary seconded the motion, and it passed.

Calendar: Communion will be served April 7. The calendar was approved by unanimous consent.

Missionaries Julius and Helen Hagan joined us via ZOOM to update us on their ministry efforts in Belgium. They thanked us for our financial and prayerful support of their Cup of Cold Water ministry. Currently, they are working with about 140 Ukraine refugees helping them find housing, education, and jobs. They shared that their most important needs at this time are 1) a bus/van to transport the refugees. They are currently raising support for the purchase. They are still about \$9000 short of the purchase price. 2) seeking monthly stipend support from churches they are hoping to raise partnership contributions to support them in their work. 3) They are working to create refugee jobs – possibly establishing a coffee shop in their town in Belgium. Need to raise money for rent and getting the business established. 4) Our prayers are vital to their continued ministry.

PNC Report: Pastor Laurie reported that she is our COM representative. She plans to meet with our PNC and, with Session's guidance, help us determine what we can sustainably afford for a pastor's salary. At our current status, we could sustainably afford approximately \$25000/year without using our reserves.

Presbytery Report: The next meeting will be a hybrid meeting on May 14.

Communications: from Donna 1) Are there plans for a Maundy Thursday worship service? – none There will be an ecumenical Good Friday Worship service at 7 PM at Zion United Methodist Church. There will be an ecumenical choir for the service. Anyone wishing to sing with the choir is invited to come to practice at 6 PM at Zion prior to the service. 2) She requests to switch her April Fridays off – Work the 26th and have the 19th off – okay 3) needs help folding the newsletters – put an appeal in the newsletter 4) still having issues with guest pastors getting their info to her too late in the week – thankfully, Pastor Laurie will be back in the pulpit soon, so this will become a non-issue **Clerk's Report**: Will be out of state for the next Session meeting April 9. Requests a Clerk Pro Tem.

Financial Report: Printed report submitted shows income was higher than expenses for the month. <u>Jessica made the motion to receive the report into our records</u>. Sandy seconded the motion, and it passed.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Laurie reported 1) She met with Mendota Area Ministerial Association (MAMA). They will meet the first Tuesday of each month. Plans are formulated for an ecumenical Good Friday worship service at 7 PM at Zion United Methodist Church. 2) Mendota First United Methodist Church is interested in having a Micropantry. We have no problem with them having, despite reports to the contrary. It will provide more opportunities to serve the people of Mendota. 3) Cathy Burke from Mendota First United Methodist and Jessica Cox are organizing an evening VBS for the community. It will be held July 29 through August 2. More details will be shared as they become available. Volunteers will be needed in many areas. 4) Pastor suggested offering camp scholarships for Stronghold camps again this year. Jessica made the motion to offer 10 scholarships this summer, utilizing funds in our scholarship-designated accounts. Kim seconded the motion, and it passed. The availability of the scholarships will be posted on the Micropantry Facebook page and in the Micropantry. 5) Pastor visited Joyce, LaVerle, and Art and will soon meet with Ev. 5) Our May 19 worship service will be dedicated to the memory of Don and Carol Gooden. It will be advertised through the church Facebook page. 6) Our brainstorming meeting to reveal and discuss the ideas submitted for church service and strengthening ideas submitted on index cards will be following worship on March 24th.

Budget and Stewardship: We currently have \$146000 in a general savings account. Treasurer Peggy would like to move \$100000 to CDs for a higher rate of interest. There is a 6 month CD paying 4.55% interest and a 10 month CD paying 4.6% interest currently.

Diane made the motion to authorize Peggy to move \$50000 to the 6 month CD and \$50000 to the 10 month CD. Andra seconded the motion, and it passed.

Christian Education: Lessons are ready and we are blessed to have willing teachers.

Property and Maintenance: 1) Gary has signed the contract and put down the deposit for roof repairs. 2) The required fire extinguisher inspections have taken place. 3) The east rain gutters are rusted through and not connected to downspouts. The gutters above the Jesus in the garden stained glass window are completely rotted through and have bird nests in them. Gary will get estimates for new rain gutters and downspouts on the east side of the church.

Personnel and Pastoral Relations: topics covered in Communications

Worship and Music: 1) Bill has all the Sundays covered for pulpit supply. 2) Jacob Schmitt is considering joining the rotation for pianists. Discussion revealed that Melissa Blum's brother, Greg Archer, also plays the piano. We could investigate the possibility of his willingness to play.

Evangelism, Outreach, and Missions: 1) AED pads can be ordered on Amazon.com at a savings over what we currently pay. 2) A newly-formed 4-H group would like to borrow 2 tables and 15-20 chairs for a one-time use. Session granted their request. 3) One Great Hour of Sharing is our current mission focus. Two video clips were sent to Andra to promote this offering, but they were not able to be shown on our screen in the sanctuary. Andra will look into this. **Fellowship and Parish Life**: Diane is grateful to be back and thankful for all who have covered for her while she was unable to be with us.

Sandy made the motion to adjourn, Gary seconded the motion, and it passed. Pastor Laurie closed our meeting with prayer.
