Session Highlights

Session met for their regular April meeting April 9, 2024.

Calendar: Rev David Spaulding is preaching on May 5. Communion will be served May 5.

Financial Report: Treasurer Peggy Etheridge reported that the two \$50,000 CD's have been purchased.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Laurie reported she and Faye served shut-in communion to 3 individuals. She attended a planning meeting for Vacation Bible School. This will be ecumenical with First Methodist and Zion Methodist. It will be held July 29 through August 2 in the evening at Zion, starting with a light meal at 5:30. The theme is "Rocky Railroad" for grades Pre-K through 6th. Pastor Laurie will be preaching in her home church on September 8, and will also be absent for November 3 and November 10.

Maintenance and Property: 1) Gary reported that on April 3, water was coming into the basement through the floor drain near the kitchen. He called TJS Excavating to clean out the drain, and the issue has not returned. 2) Ron Blum fixed the door closer on the women's restroom. 3) Gary reattached some loose downspouts. 4) The shingle repairs will take place this coming week. 5) Matt Arjes will be performing routine boiler maintenance. 6) Gary had two estimates for repairs to rotted gutters on the east side: Elite Seamless Gutters-\$8000; Alpha Storm Solutions-\$2376.

Worship and Music: Jacob Schmitt will be playing for worship on April 21, 2024.

Evangelism, Outreach and Missions: 1) In Jessica's absence, Pastor Laurie reported on the success of the egg hunt. With children, parents, and church helpers, it was estimated that 100 people were in attendance. 2) Head Start is now able to have outside visitors. Tuesdays are the selected days, but we need to confirm with Jessica how to facilitate this. 3) The current mission focus is the Pentecost Offering, through May 5. 40% of this offering will remain with our church, earmarked for VBS. 4) Offerings for Abigale's baby bottle campaign will be taken May 12 through June 16.

Pastor Laurie reviewed the results of the all-church discerning meeting and Session agreed to move forward with the top three suggestions:

- 1) Bible verse yard signs with church logo. 4M Graphics was a suggested vendor
- 2) Saturday morning free breakfast, once a month; 2nd Saturday suggested
- 3) Coffee time during the week; suggested Tuesdays at 10:30

The next Session meeting will be Tuesday, May 21, 2024 at 7 pm.

Per Capita

It has been said that **per capita** apportionment is like a utility bill.
