BACKGROUND

PCEA Maua Town Church is located about 100 Metres from Maua Town Center. This makes the church attract a lot of visitors during Sunday services and any other time events are held here.

Among these visitors are street children who visit the Church for food and other assistance. Their frequent visits made the leadership of the church think of a fairly sustainable way of incorporating them in the church. To offer not only spiritual nourishment but also help them cope with life, by way of having some income.

As a result, on 14th February, 2019, the church hosted about 30 boys and girls for prayers and breakfast. Since then it has become a routine to have these children every Sunday from 8.00 – 9.00am. Their program is well coordinated by the Parish Minister assisted by the Church elders and deacons.

Through the years, we have been able to reach to over 50 children from Maua Town and neighboring markets. The church has managed to provide not only food on Sundays but also clothing, empowering some to run small businesses, taking some back to school and attaching others in garages for apprenticeship.

The church plans to empower more street children to be self-reliant. To achieve this, we hope to partner with donors and well-wishers for funding, business community in town who can be willing to accept them for training (apprenticeship), educational institutions where they can be enrolled to complete their education or TVET colleges where they can learn some skills.

We also hope that through the funds received, we can be able to provide tools of trade to those already trained or attached somewhere.

Our pictorial coverage explicitly demonstrates some of the activities we have undertaken.

Our Presbytery COM representative, Pastor Laurie Walker, met with Peggy. They updated our job offerings on the CLC website to appeal to a wider base of possible job seekers.

Pastor Laurie went on the recent Presbytery tour. Attendees saw the oldest church in Illinois (Galena), toured the Apple River Fort in Elizabeth, Illinois as part of the research into the name of our Presbytery "Blackhawk", discussed establishing dialog with the Sauk Nation, and shared other pieces of history as they pertain to the area within our Presbytery. The September Presbytery meeting will be at Stronghold.

Session discussed the signs to be displayed in members' front yards.

Our financial report shows us once again with a small surplus of income over expenses both for the month and year-to-date. Again, we couldn't do it without faithful giving.

Pastor Laurie had the opportunity to take communion to our shut-ins, assisted by Carol Erwin. Pastor reports that the Free Family breakfast and the Fill My Cup weekly meeting are both blessings in the life of the church and the community.

We learned from Christian Education that 1) 20 children have registered so far for VBS, and there will be a VBS planning meeting June 24 at 6:30 PM at Zion – anyone interested is welcome to attend, volunteers will be handing out fliers at the food truck event on Main Street that evening at 6 PM – anyone is welcome to come help, 2) glue guns and glue sticks are needed for decorating and for VBS, 3) so far, 4 kids have submitted Stronghold Scholarship applications. We are hoping more area children will apply.

Rev. David Spaulding compliments Bill Bratney for his work in filling our pulpit with pulpit supply as the need arises. Worship and Music is trying to use more "spirit songs" in our time of worship.

Our Evangelism and Outreach committee reports that the Saturday Free Family breakfasts could use more attendees – everyone is welcome and those who attend always enjoy the time of fellowship and food. Our next two breakfasts will be July 13 and August 17 8:30 to 10 AM. Why not come and bring a friend ?

Our Mission Team received an email from Elder Joseph Bundy in Kenya letting us know that they have a new pastor. Their ministry oversees street families to develop their self-reliance.

Our next regular Session meeting will be August 20.


