FROM THE PASTOR

Church Family and Friends,

For me, the past month has been a whirl wind of loss. First in Arizona, my brother-in-law died following a month of recovery in the hospital from a heart attack. Next, I received the call from Peggy on the passing of her mother, Joyce, a pillar of this church. And finally, we flew home in time to be with my mother-in-law, Mary Ellen in her last hours as she died in her home in Yorkville Cedarhurst. All three of these lives, Dave's, Joyce's, and Mary Ellen's make me think of Psalm 91... *'you who live in the shelter of the Lord...*

¹⁵When they call to me, I will answer them; I will be with them in trouble; I will rescue them and honor them. ¹⁶With long life I will satisfy them and show them my salvation.

I am also reminded that in our deepest grief, our deepest despair, God gives us the hope we need to go forward.

Psalm 51:12 Restore to me the joy of your salvation, and sustain in me a willing spirit.

Need I say that I already feel like I am in the season of Lent waiting for the triumph of the resurrection. Lent begins with Ash Wednesday and it will soon to be upon us. St. John's Lutheran Church has graciously invited us to join them for at 6:30 March 5 for their Ash Wednesday Service which will include communion. I hope you might be able to join our good neighbors at this meaningful service.

Luke 4 ¹Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit, returned from the Jordan and was led by the Spirit in the wilderness, ²where for forty days he was tested by the devil. He ate nothing at all during those days, and when they were over, he was famished.

May we all enter this time of Lent led by the Spirit, facing our temptations, feeling hungry for God in our lives. May we spend our 40 days (not counting Sundays) preparing our hearts for the crucifixion, death and resurrection of our Lord. As you read this, we will have flown back to Arizona to finish our rental time and get our car. I will be back with you for the third Sunday of Lent, March 23.

Please remember March 23 is also the Sunday we will be changing our worship time to 10:30–11:30 a.m.. Please note that our fellowship time will change from after church to before church. Plan on coming at 10:00 to enjoy a snack and drink with your church family.




Missions

 Some prayers tug at your heart, like the one for a dad and another for his dad back. We don't know the whole story, but GOD does. A mother asking for prayers for her daughters for strength, peace and courage. All the parents and the kids were there to learn about God's love. A child asks for his favorite book series. He has a love for reading that will maybe lead to a better reader of the Lords words. A child asked to be watched over as they entered second grade. That can be scary. One kid asks for friends and another, for help with love, no sin, and God.
 Another asking to watch over all who would be around the children during their school days from bus drivers to the crossing guards, teachers, and janitors.
 The motto is "TRUST JESUS " when we slip up. Let's raise all these prayers up to the Lord and trust that he knows how to help answer these children's prayers. Roman's 8:28 God works for the Good of those who love him—these kids may not personally know God yet—but YOU DO, and we have been called for his purpose. The Lord can intervene for these kids.

We have a temperature controlled cooler so bread, butter, milk, eggs and cheeses are always a blessing to those in need. Thank you to all who help keep this Micropantry going strong.

Helping Those in Need

I took a disabled senior to the Food Pantry last month. Are you aware that people can only go to the Food Pantry once a month? For one person, you get 1 lb. of ground beef, 4 pork chops and 3 cans of vegetables. You get a cart full of groceries, but then you have to hope you can make enough meals to last a month. I was able to see first hand ... its NOT enough to eat for 2 weeks, if you're eating 3 meals a day. The food Pantry is helping subsidize meals, it cannot give everyone a month's worth of food. They are there to help the best way they can. Our Micropantry is helping those in need to try to make meals every day also. Some skip medications to have meals.

This month, let us focus on condiments, seasonings and baking. It's hard to cook from scratch when you have no seasonings or basics like flour, sugar, butter flavored shortening, ketchup, mustard, soy sauce, salsa, onion/garlic powder, chili powder, salt, pepper, butter and oil. So if you're out and about, try to support the 2 Micropanttries in our community. If you can grab a few of these items and place them in a pantry to help our community make meals with flavor and fill in the gaps that are lacking. We can always use ANY non-perishable food items. Thanks for helping out those in our community who need a boost. Have a blessed month. Thank you for being a blessing to those in need.

The Session of Mendota First Presbyterian Church met for their regular February 2025 meeting on February 18, 2025 at 7 PM at the church.

Kim opened our meeting with a devotion based on Romans 8:35-39, then led us in prayer.

Calendar: Communion will be served March 2. March 15 will be the pancake breakfast and St. Patrick's Day craft.

PNC Report: Our MDP is ready to go. Earlville Presbyterian is working on their MDP. Pastor Laurie will e-mail members of Session a copy of the MDP once it is ready to go so they can review it and approve/suggest changes. Hope to get it live sometime in the month of March.

Presbytery Report: The meeting last week was all on-line. Everything went fine; all amendments were approved. Had a speaker about church vitality—working to keep the church alive. Also talked about the family—church concept to draw more families to worship.

Communications: 1) We received a letter from the Presbyterian Ministry of Encouragement and Support thanking us for our gifts which were purchased from the Presbyterian Giving catalog—a share of a cow and a piglet. 2) Received a note from Donna thanking Session for the Christmas bonus. 3) Received three communications from Donna: a) She is working on elevator inspection, which is due in May. She has scheduled an appointment for the inspection for April 15. b) Surf will be connecting us to their internet and phone service as soon as the ground is soft enough. We will still retain the Frontier phone contract for the elevator phone. c) Is wondering if there will be an ecumenical Ash Wednesday service this year. 4) There have been letters in the Micropantry and cooler box from a family who homeschools. The three children created worksheets of communications to the church as part of their studies. Jessica had Keagon reply to the notes. He invited the children and mom to come check out our church. 5) Gary had an interaction with a neighbor of the church. In an email Gary shared with the Session, he said, "I went by church after work today and there was a Hispanic gentleman there with a snowblower cleaning the sidewalk and Westside entrance. As best as I could understand, my Spanish is poor, he works parttime and when he is short on cash he uses the pantry and this was his way of giving back." One of the replies to this bit of good news was, "It is always encouraging to see how we are making a difference in the lives of others! I'm glad we're able to help him, and that he is inspired to pass the kindness along."

Clerk's Report: 1) Submitted Annual Statistical Report to Presbytery and General Assembly. 2) Session approved the minutes from our annual congregational meeting in February. 3) It was the sad duty of the Clerk to report the death of Joyce Burrighart on February 17.

Financial Report: Pastor Laurie presented in Peggy's absence, commenting that our finances are in good shape, as Peggy reported at the Annual Meeting.

Pastor's Report: 1) MAMA is discussing an Ash Wednesday service. St John's Lutheran is doing their own, which anyone is welcome to attend. 2) Peggy is in conversation with Pastor Laurie re: Joyce's celebration of life service. Pastor would like any Joyce stories we have to share. 3) We discussed being part of the ecumenical VBS again this year. Session is fully behind doing this.

Property and Maintenance: 1) pleased to say the snowblower is working well. 2) Regarding the gutter repair project on the East side of the church. The gutter is underneath slate tiles which would suffer damage when removed. Contractor suggests: On the section with bad gutter—remove tiles, replace gutter, replace with shingles, matching the color of the slate as closely as possible. There would be an increased cost of \$1700 to have this work done. Session authorized moving forward with this plan.

Christian Education: The teachers are looking at trying 10-10:30 Sunday School when the worship schedule changes March 23. We discussed the pros and cons of this.

Worship and Music: 1) first Sunday in March will be communion with Rev. David Spaulding. 2) Worship time change will take place March 23. 2) Pastor Laurie's covenant through March 2026 has been signed by Session. We are thankful to continue in ministry under her guidance.

Evangelism and Outreach: 1) Laura Sutton would like to do a May piano recital Sunday May 11 at 2 PM in the sanctuary. We will do this and offer ice cream and toppings after. 2) Jessica talked with Cathy Burke from FUMC about working together on this year's VBS. 3) She looked at projectors. The ones from Costco and Sam's are not the quality needed for the sanctuary. 4) Egg Hunt—will be offered to the community on April 19th at 10 AM. We will need to advertise. Last year this was a great success. 5) Keagon would like to borrow a hymnal so he can practice playing from it. Session gave consent. 6) Pancake breakfast—Discussed how to continue. 7) Pastor Laurie had a good idea regarding publicizing scholarships for church camp, family friendly church times, vbs schedule—advertise these at the Easter egg hunt.

Mission: Pastor Laurie is working on an email to send out to all the Kenya partners. We have been invited to visit Kenya again. The group will be going in October.

Fellowship and Parish Life: everything is going well.

Each day at or after a meal time, gather around this map activity. Consider the reflection and questions, place a coin or a bill (a "gift") in your fish coin bank or a jar.

Sunday: God, open our eyes to your face in every person. Let us see the ways we are all connected with all of Creation. May we as your Church, together, seek love, justice and peace with all. Amen.

March 9-14

Sunday: Gather us all around your banquet table, O God, with all who hunger and thirst. May we join together, to share the abundance you've intended for all. Amen.

March 16-21

Sunday: Encourage us, Creator, when things get difficult. May we draw creativity and hope from your Spirit, and from our partners along the way. Amen.

March 23-28

Sunday: God, you say "Come to the waters" and "Buy wine without money and bread without price." Let us learn by your generosity, the gift of giving what we have to share. Amen.

March 30-April 4

Sunday: Loving God, help us to learn from what others have seen, so that we might grow in understanding across lines of difference. Amen.

April 6-11

Passion/Palm Sunday: Guide us through the paths that feel lonely, assured that you are always with us. Be with us in the darkness as we walk by faith and not by sight. Amen.

April 13-18

Sunday - Resurrection/Easter/One Great Hour of Sharing:

Present the gifts in your coin box to your congregation. Say a prayer for all those who will receive help from your generosity.

April 20

Monday: Using the online map, find a PDA partnership near where you live. Say a prayer for those recovering from natural and human-caused disasters.

Monday: Using the online map, find an SDOF partnership near where you live. Read about the need being addressed and say a prayer for the people involved in that ministry.

Monday: Using the online map, find a project or partnership near a location you have wanted to visit, but have never been. Say a prayer for all neighbors whom you have never met.

Monday: Using the online map, find a Presbyterian Hunger Program partnership near where you live. Say a prayer for the people involved in the ministry there.

Monday: Using the online map, locate a ministry in a country far away from you. What needs are being addressed there? Say a prayer for the people involved in these ministries.

Monday: Immunizations give us hope for a day when certain diseases will no longer cause sickness and pain. Give a gift for each immunization you have received.

Tuesday: In a natural disaster, people are often unable to access their normal sources of drinking water. Sharing a gift in your fish box will help water reach people who need it.

Tuesday: Social barriers can be like locked doors that hold people back and keep them from thriving as Jesus intended. Make a gift to help open doors so all people can grow and learn freely.

Tuesday: People who care for others also need care. Do something special for the caretakers in your life to say, "Thank you."

Tuesday: When rain is scarce, special collection systems are built to catch the water so it can be used for growing plants. Give a gift to help bring water to people when it doesn't rain.

Tuesday: Without the right nutrition in the first two years of life, a child's physical and mental development is compromised. Make a gift to help ensure healthy food for infants.

Tuesday: It is estimated that nearly 1 in 11 people around the world will go to bed hungry each night. Make a gift to eliminate hunger.

Ash Wednesday: Read Isaiah 58:6-8, 12. Which actions or words stand out to you? Write a prayer of intention for Lent using some of the words from Isaiah 58.

Wednesday: Climate change is affecting growing seasons and forcing families to leave their homes. Make a gift to OGHs to help people working to address climate change.

Wednesday: Clean water is a necessity for every living thing. Using the online map, find three projects related to water. Give a gift for each faucet in your house.

Wednesday: Wiggly worms and buzzing bees are essential to healthy soils and plants. Give a gift of thanks for all the little things that help the world grow.

Wednesday: Electricity is usually the first utility that is lost in a storm. Can you identify a favorite Bible verse about light? Make a gift in honor of the verse.

Wednesday: The vulnerable are often the most impacted in emergency situations. Visit pcusa.org/GOHkits and ask your church to assemble kits for such emergencies.

Wednesday: Education helps lift people out of poverty. OGHs helps kids world wide attend school. Make a gift and consider donating books to a local reading program.

Thursday: Think of three people you are thankful for. Find a way to let them know you are thinking about them. Consider sharing a gift in their honor.

Thursday: When situations are difficult, whom do you call upon? Give a gift to honor someone in your life for the specific way that they support you.

Thursday: What are you thankful for in yourself? God offers gifts and talents to each of us. Make a short list of yours and make them part of a "Thank you, God" prayer.

Thursday: The right supplies make all the difference, whether you are growing crops or learning at school. Remember the last time you had the right tool for a project, and make a gift as part of remembering.

Thursday: Social support and connection are important parts of being healthy. Give a gift of gratitude for one person or place that offers welcome to you.

Thursday: Think of all the things people share with you. Write a thank you note to one of these people and give a gift of thanks for their care.

Thursday: Blankets are used internationally to comfort those impacted by war and disasters. Give a gift for each blanket on your bed.

Friday: Blue T-Shirt Sunday celebrates the ministry of Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA). Wear a blue shirt for worship this Sunday and learn more at pda.pcusa.org.

Friday: Self-Development of People (SDOP) Sunday is in two days! Visit pcusa.org/sdop to learn about their community partnerships. Make a gift to honor our partners around the world.

Friday: Millions of Americans live in a food desert, far from a store where they can buy fresh food. Make a gift for each grocery store near your home.

Friday: Make up a mealtime prayer and use it during meals this weekend. Give a gift in thanks for the food you have.




